POSITION SUMMARY:

This position will be accountable by assuming responsibility for overseeing the operational function of the clinical department. This position will provide staff training for clinical services. This position is responsible for all aspects of the staff nurse duties using the nursing process of assessment, planning, implementing, and evaluation in the pre, intra and post procedure care of all patients.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Graduate of Accredited School of Nursing
- RN with active California license, no restrictions
- One (1) year of nursing experience, preferably, in an ambulatory surgery center
- CPR and ACLS certification
- Strong ethical and moral character references
- Basic computer skills

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Interface with co-workers and physicians regarding patient care issues
- Act as the patient advocate in the pre, intra, and post procedure areas
- Check monitoring equipment daily to assure working order to include but not limited to; defibrillator, EKG monitor, automatic blood pressure unit, and lab testing equipment, if appropriate
- Assess patient status on admission and on an on-going basis
- Implement pre-operative routine care including obtaining I.V. access
- Communicate relevant information to physician, facility manager and appropriate staff
- Assist physician with specimen collection and ensure correct labeling, documentation, and transport procedure in accordance with the policy
- Perform waive testing as requested
- Document all aspects of patient care as required by policy
- Assist in transporting patients from the Pre Op area and to the Recovery Room
- Provide patient care appropriate to age specific need
- Review policies and procedures specific to equipment utilization based on manufacturer's recommendations/maintains ongoing review
- Analyze and evaluate nursing care to improve quality of care given
- Coordinate patient-care activities with physician and anesthesia providers to provide continuity of patient care
- Respond to emergency situations and maintains competency
- Ability to effectively communicate information, respond to questions, and professionally interact with physicians, managers, employees, clients, vendors, and the general public
- Use safety checklist
- Oversee the care, cleaning, high-level disinfection, sterilization, and required maintenance of instruments, supplies, and equipment to maintain proper working conditions
- Delegate staffing duties appropriately to unlicensed assistive personnel in accordance with scope of practice

- Assist the Clinical Manager with the review, development and implementation of clinical policies and procedures to ensure optimal training outcomes
- Able to direct others related to the day to day schedule of assignments
- Participate in primary care of patients as needed and oversees clinical areas to verify that patient needs are met
- Work collaboratively with scheduling personnel to coordinate procedure scheduling
- Recommend and support revision of patient-care policies and procedures as necessary to conform to accepted principles and practices
- Oversee all nursing activities during emergencies to ensure patient needs are met
- Manages optimal patient and staff flow to prevent opportunities for healthcare acquired and surgical site infections
- Adhere to safety policies and procedures in performing and promoting job duties and responsibilities
- Identifies Center emergency situations (e.g. fire, disaster) and notifies appropriate personnel and external agencies
- Monitor the center's physical environment to ensure the maintenance of safety, comfort, cleanliness and efficiency
- Work with the Safety Officer to resolve observed or suspected safety violations and hazards to ensure policy/procedure compliance
- Assist the Infection Control Nurse and the Administrator in monitoring and reporting quality initiatives for practice improvement
- Review chart prior to delivering care
- Complete care activity within specified time frame
- Administer and chart medications as ordered by physician
- Attend all required education
- Regular and predictable attendance
- Perform other duties as assigned
